According to Mr. Rankin, Facebook has become one of the world's largest gathering spots for artists and is one of the best ways to get your work seen and critiqued by fellow artists worldwide. And it's another avenue to promote and sell your work around the world. David has just under 5000 Facebook friends and another 14,000 waiting to become friends from all over the planet who follow his work on FB. When it was pointed out to Mr. Rankin that many of us don't use Facebook and many more of us don't even use computers that much, he responded that everybody has a grandson or next-door neighbor who would be glad to help us. He considers Facebook one of the most important tools an artist can use to promote themselves and best of all, it's FREE.
