PROGRAM

Come to our May meeting...you don't want to miss this one! We are featuring award winning artist, Gary Williams. Gary will demonstrate his pastel techniques that he uses to create his beautiful portraits. Gary had a long and successful career as a lawyer and legal educator. But he says, "I came back to that which has been the enduring force in my life - fine art." While practicing law and teaching, he attended Cooper School of Art and never stopped painting and developing his unique style. He has won numerous awards and his works are shown throughout Ohio and across the nation.

Gary paints in pastels, oils, and watercolor. However, mixed media is his favorite method of bringing life to his portraits. In his Nubian series, he uses traditional African cloth and contemporary materials to liberate his subjects from the paper. In 2012, Gary traveled to Kenya where he lived in a rural Maasai village for a month. There he captured the beauty and spirit of the people in his watercolor series, Kajiado. His Jazz Series is an homage to his father, an amateur musician and jazz aficionado. In this body of work, Gary brings black and white pastel and charcoal images to life in a vivid, free form design created by wet-on-wet watercolor, which adds an almost otherworldly dimension to the composition. In 2013 Gary was awarded the prestigious Creative Workforce Fellowship by the Community Partnership for Arts and Culture, and Cuyahoga Arts and Culture.
