Dorothy joined Euclid Art in 2015. She is a multimedia artist, painting in all mediums. Dorothy's art journey started as a very young child. She was born into a family of artists and musicians. Her father was a concert pianist and her aunt was a soprano who sang with John Phillip Sousa. Dottie received her Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Massachusetts College of Art. Her first job after college was at MIT as a technical illustrator. A move took her to Columbus, OH where she worked as a senior technical artist at North American Aviation. There she created 3-D renderings of blueprints for the F-111 fighter airplane. She moved to Mentor, OH, raised a family and started doing portraits and teaching art. She taught classes in her basement and then moved to her Pencil and Brush studio on Mentor Avenue, where she taught for 30 years. For the next 11 years, she taught art at the Phillips Osborne Middle School in Painsville, OH. When she thought that she would finally retire, she was asked to teach art classes at Wildwood Cultural Center, where she is teaching now!
