#### **PROGRAM**

EAA member **Suzette Cohen** will be our featured demonstrator as we start our new season. Suzette, a long time acrylic painter, will demonstrate one of the **newest acrylic techniques called poured or fluid acrylics**. This technique is taking the acrylic world by storm, as it has huge followings on both Facebook and Pinterest, worldwide. This is how Suzette describes it...add a pouring medium to fluid acrylic paint, to the consistency of heavy cream. Then pour it on a surface, like a canvas, using various methods called pour, flow, puddle or dirty pour. Pick up the canvas and tilt it to let the paint run, creating marbling, rivers and if silicon is added to the paint, even amazing cellular designs....resulting in many beautiful abstract paintings. Come watch Suzette create these interesting, colorful abstracts. Her acrylic painting, *Answers Were Mysterious*, won 1st place in May at our Spring Fine Art Show.

**Saturday, October 7, 2017** <u>"A Tag Team Floral Watercolor Workshop"</u> with Cathy Welner and Bob Moyer, two of Ohio's premiere award-winning artists. Join in, pair up while Cathy and Bob mix and match their different watercolor techniques to produce an amazing floral watercolor, as you will too! While pairing is optional . . . it's more fun and challenging as a team. Everyone will end with a painting. Cathy and Bob will instruct throughout the class in their unique techniques to make this a fun time experience. Cost is \$45 for members, \$55 for non-members. Cathy and Bob have impressive art bios and currently teach watercolor classes at Cliffside Artist Collaborative in Hinckley, OH.

**Saturday, October 28, 2017** <u>"Development of the Portrait in Black & White"</u> with award-winning artist, Dottie Geisert. Dottie has been an active member of Euclid Art since 2015. This workshop consists of a lecture, demonstration and presentation of Dottie's approach to the portrait in black and white. Having taught classes in the portrait from the very basic to the more advanced, Dottie will present a clear and readily understandable approach for the students. After a complete understanding of the approach and applications of these theories, the student will be given the opportunity to apply the learned material to the drawing of a portrait from a live model. Cost is \$40 for members, \$50 for non-members. Dottie currently teaches multi-media art classes at the Wildwood Cultural Center in Mentor, OH.

### LOOKING AHEAD TO WORKSHOPS IN 2018....

**Saturday, April 28, 2018 "Painting Trees in Watercolor"**, instructor, **David Rankin**. To quote David... "The ability to paint trees in transparent watercolor has been a basic skill set in many watercolor painter's repertoire for a couple hundred years or so. The most crucial skill needed for painting trees in transparent watercolor is the ability to merge wet brushwork into coherent & complex shapes quickly. The trick to painting a variety of trees lies in this ability to develop

trees, one section at a time, working quickly and effectively. And then... learning how to apply additional layers of branches onto top of earlier brushwork... in order to develop the illusion of visual depth." Cost is \$50 for members, \$65 for non-members and \$45 for students w/ID.

Three-day series, June, 1, 2, 3, 2018 on the "Coolest Watercolor Techniques...More Essential Training", instructor, David Rankin. In David's workshop you will learn how to create many of transparent watercolor's very coolest visual effects. Each skill has a precise procedure. Each skill creates distinctive visual effects. If you know how to create a specific visual effect... and then add another... and another... you can create dramatic images. This workshop is about learning how to "do it right"... especially with watercolor's coolest washes. David will train you in 4-5 of watercolor's most wonderful and widely used wash procedures. ### A LOOK BACK ....

.....at David Rankin's Essential Watercolor Skills Training Workshop, held June 2, 3, 4, 2017. *Essential Watercolor Skills Training* was another fantastic weekend workshop with David Rankin. **Thank you, David!** And thanks to everyone who participated. We had a full class...members came from all over northeast Ohio, from New Jersey, Michigan and even British Columbia!

We learned....and for some of us....relearned the broken stroke, twisted-torso stroke, flawless and graded washes, wet glisten skies, plus the value of the darkest darks in a painting. The importance of using Arches Rough Paper and Steve Quiller's 1-inch wash brush became obvious as David showed us these techniques.

David said that if we couldn't explain to him how we did 'it', we really didn't 'own' the technique. How many times did he ask us to repeat "how to lay down a glisten?" Do you remember? Do you also remember....dip, lift, touch your brush in the water for a graded wash or drag and lift for a pine tree. And another reminder most of us needed.... "use your arm, not your wrist" to move the brush across the paper....no dabbling! We put it all together into three completed landscape paintings.

Also, we thank everyone who brought in all those goodies to share....mini bagels, cherries, fruit bowl, cookies, donuts, brownies, hummus & chips, coffee, etc. The Euclid Art Association is becoming known for it's good food as well as its talented artists!
