LOOKING AHEAD TO NEXT CHRISTMAS

The EAA Board decided to hold our **2018 Christmas party in the Church's Fellowship Hall**. There are many reasons for this decision. Not as many members participated in this year's party, as compared to the previous year. In 2016, we had 61 participants and collected \$335 towards the Henn rental fee of \$400. This year, we had 48 participants and collected \$260. In 2016, we only lost \$65, but this year we lost \$140. The Henn is not very well lit, especially where the auction items were displayed. In the dining room, with people going down both sides of the food table, it was hard to see the food and read the nice food signs that Ellen Howard had made. Also, it's harder to keep food warm/hot in the Henn kitchen, which is a much smaller space than the church's kitchen. Separation of guests between two dining area rooms is also an issue and the space between dining tables in the living room is very tight...too tight, too close together. For these reasons, we came to this decision. If you have any views on the matter, please make them known to us.
